

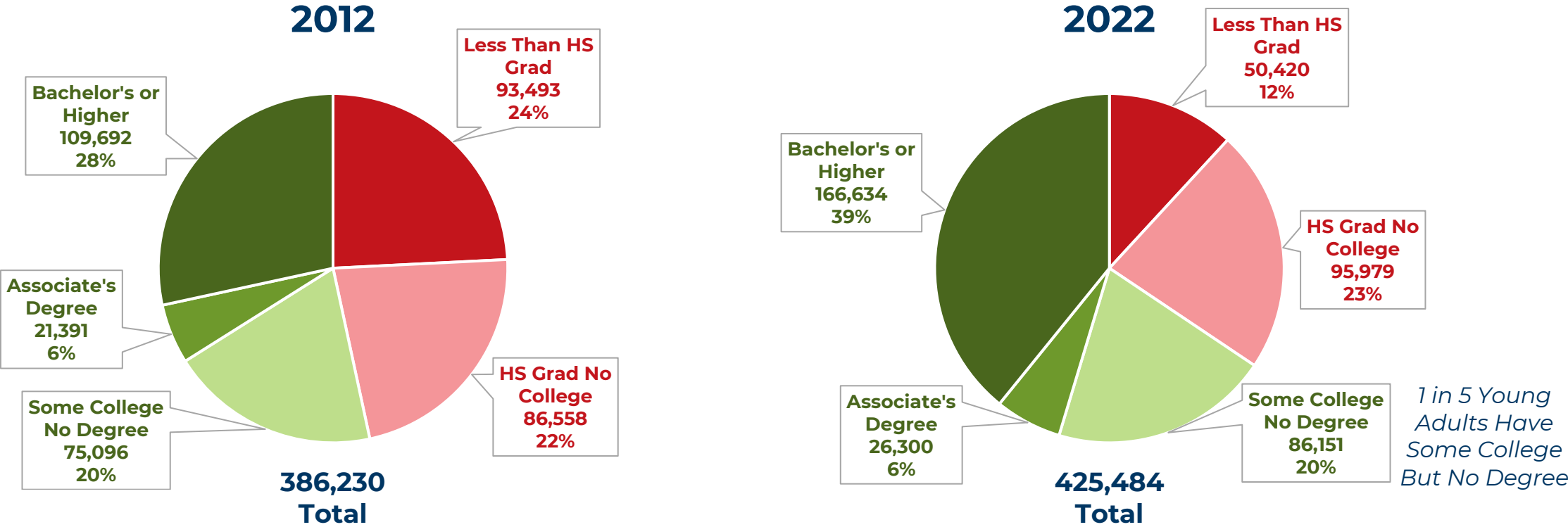
Dallas County Educational Attainment 2022 vs 2012

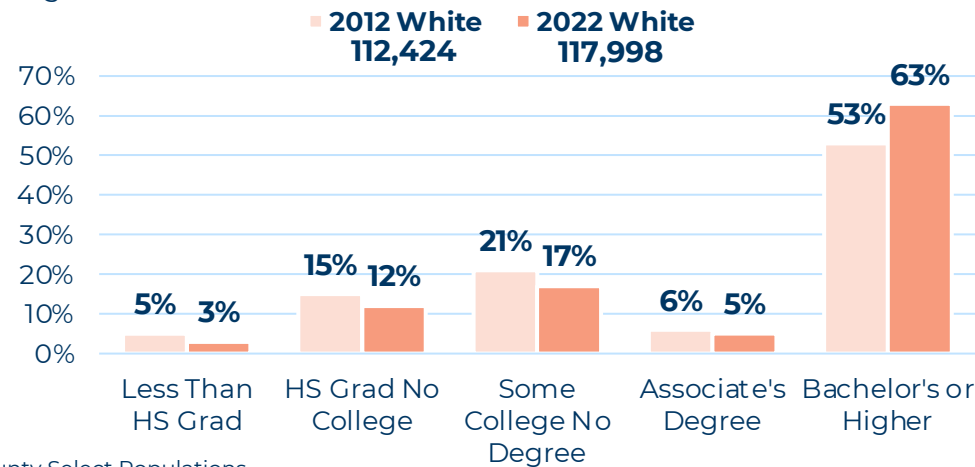
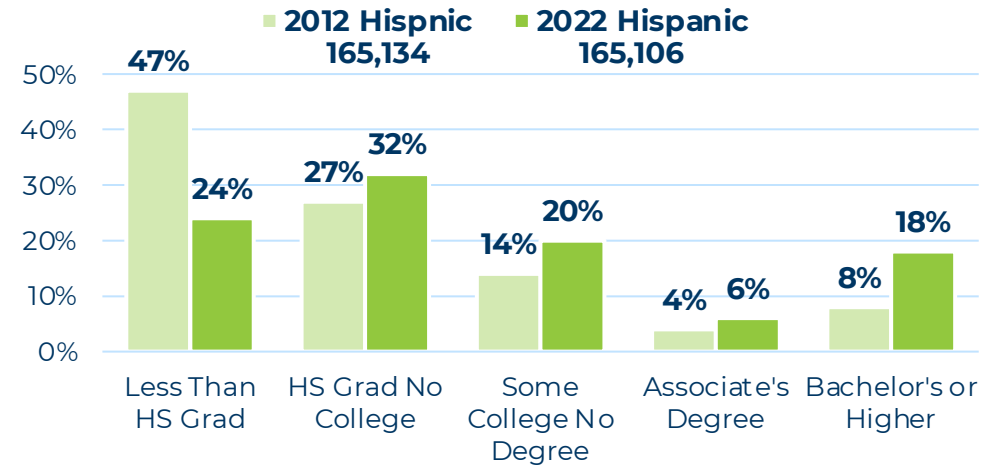
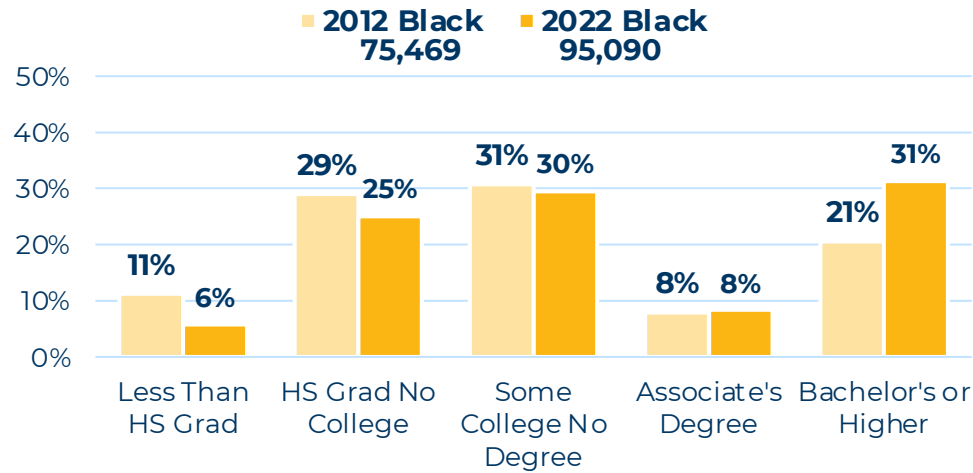
Dallas County Young Adult (Age 25-34) Count & Educational Attainment, 2012 vs 2022

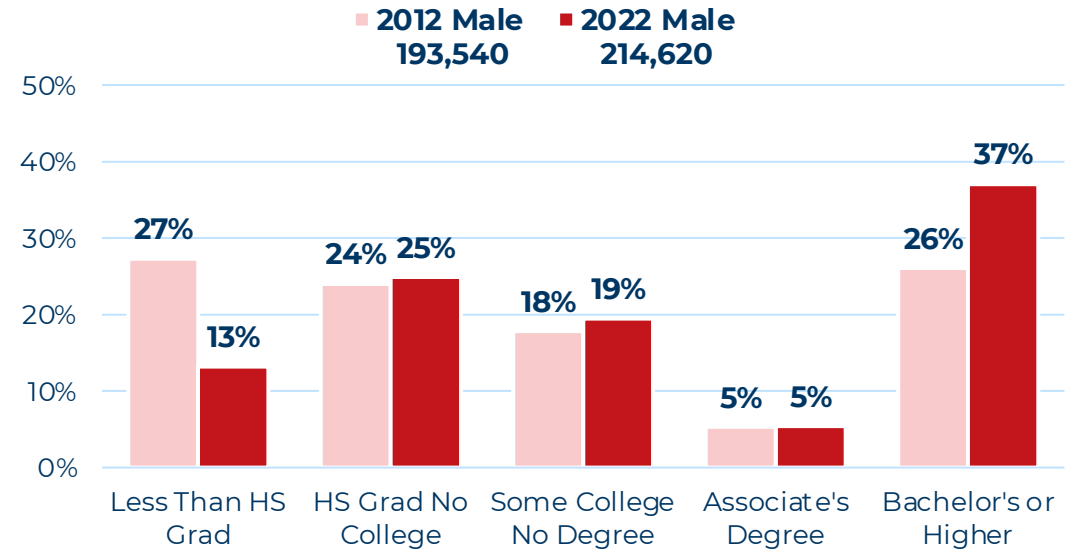
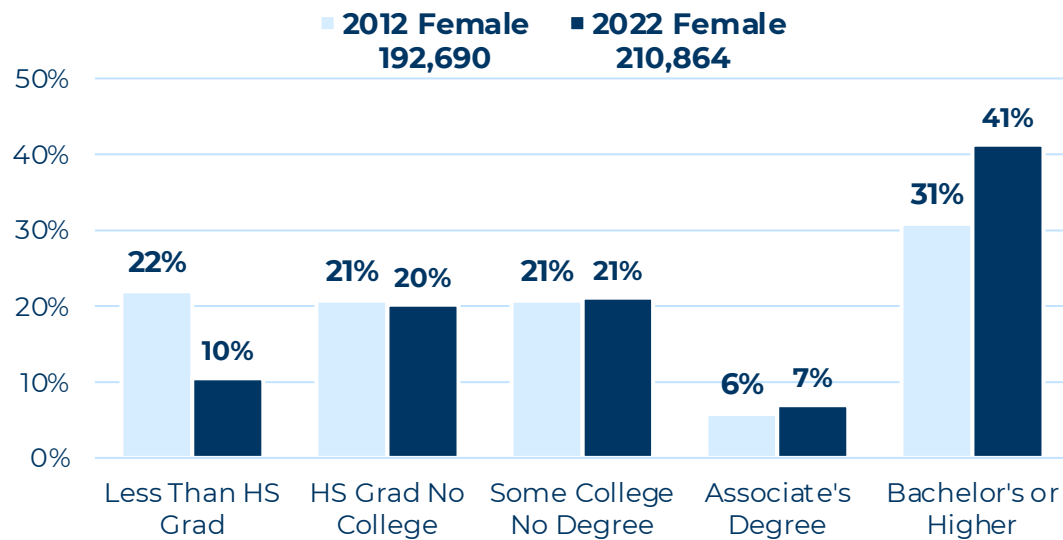
Dallas County Young Adult (Age 25-34) Count & Educational Attainment by Race, 2012 vs 2022

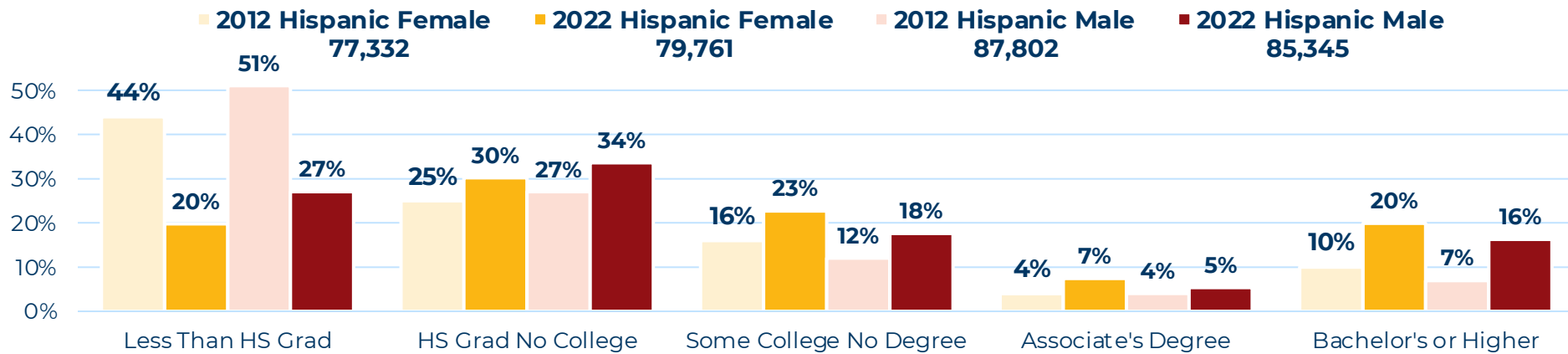
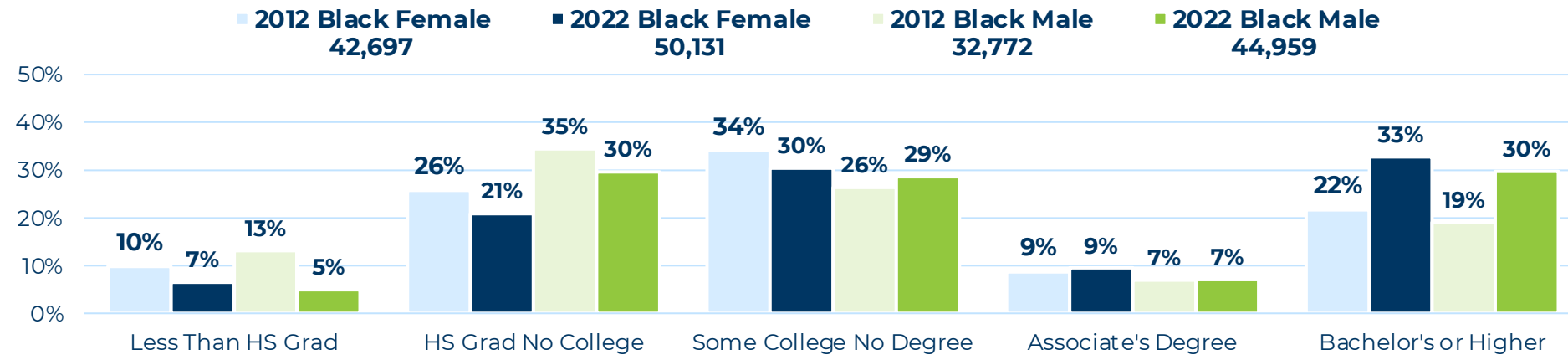
Dallas County Young Adult (Age 25-34) Count & Educational Attainment by Gender, 2012 vs 2022
