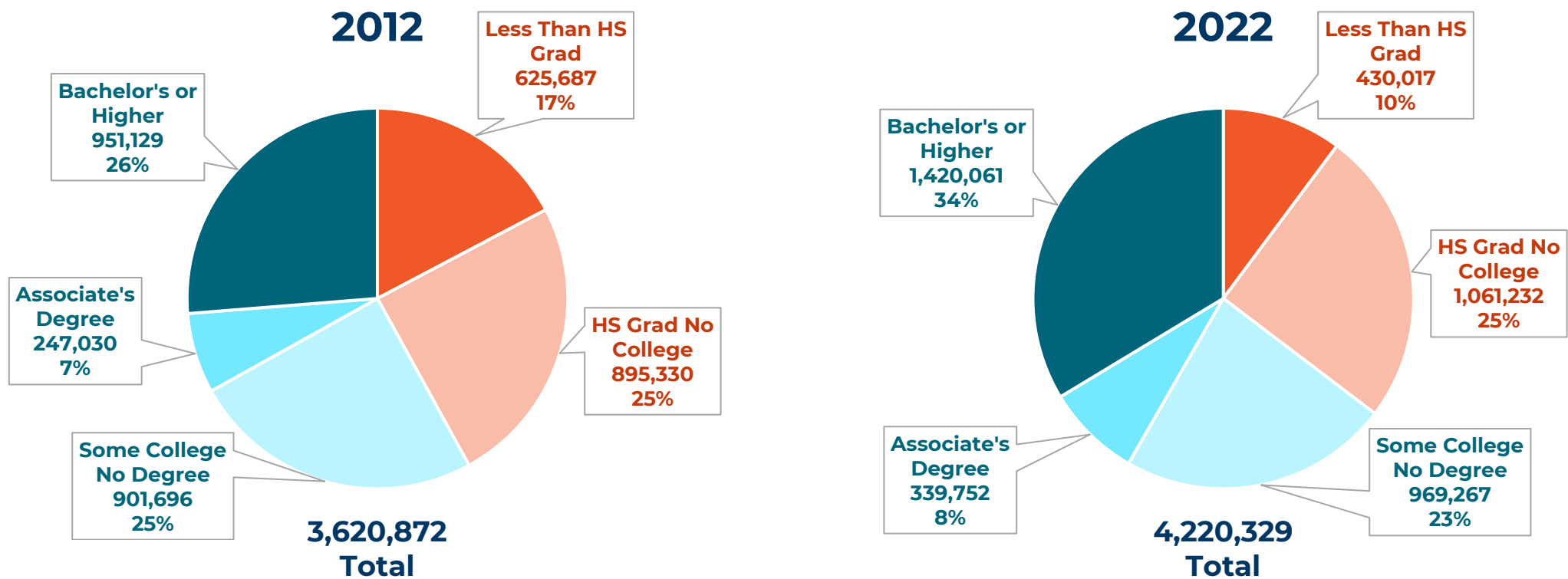

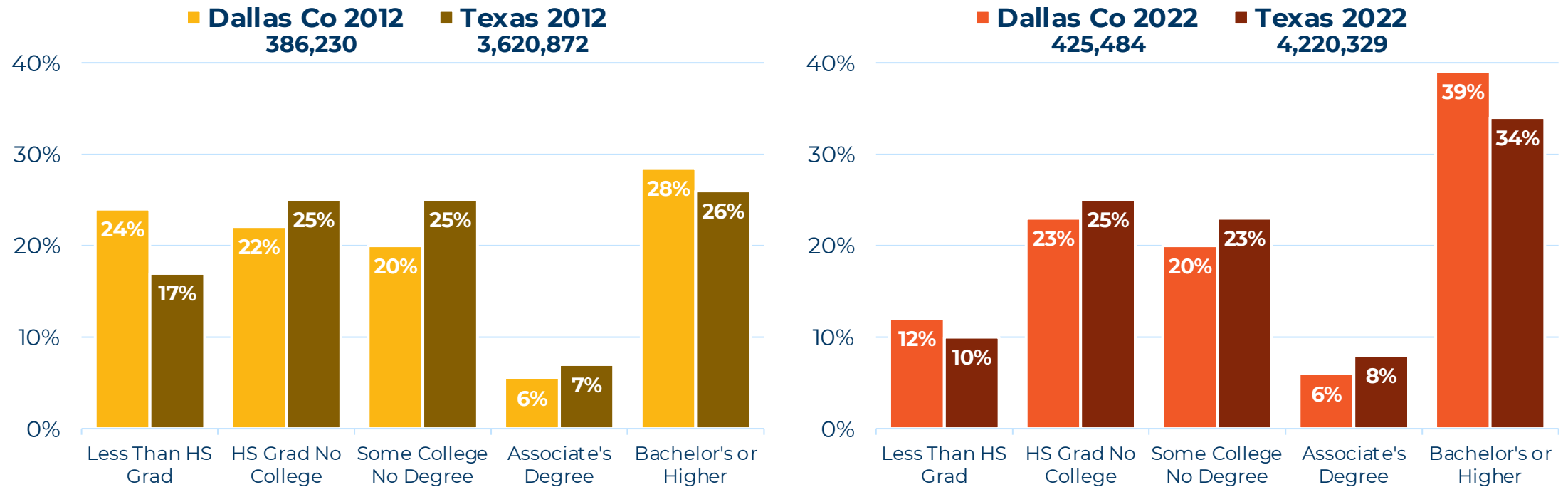
State of Texas Young Adult (Age 25-34) Count & Educational Attainment, 2012 vs 2022

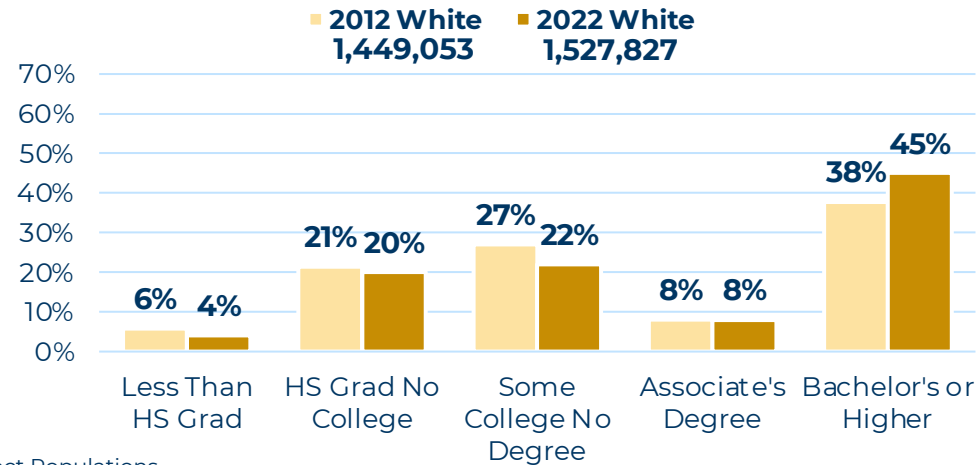
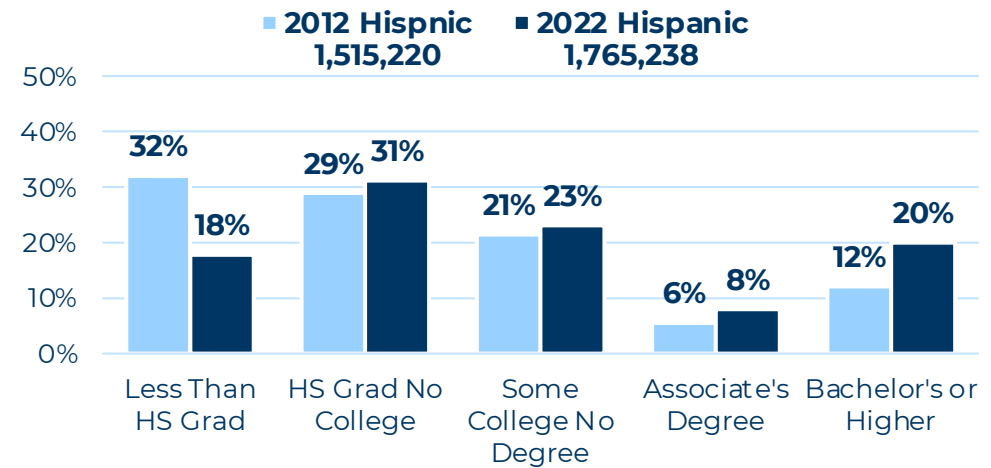
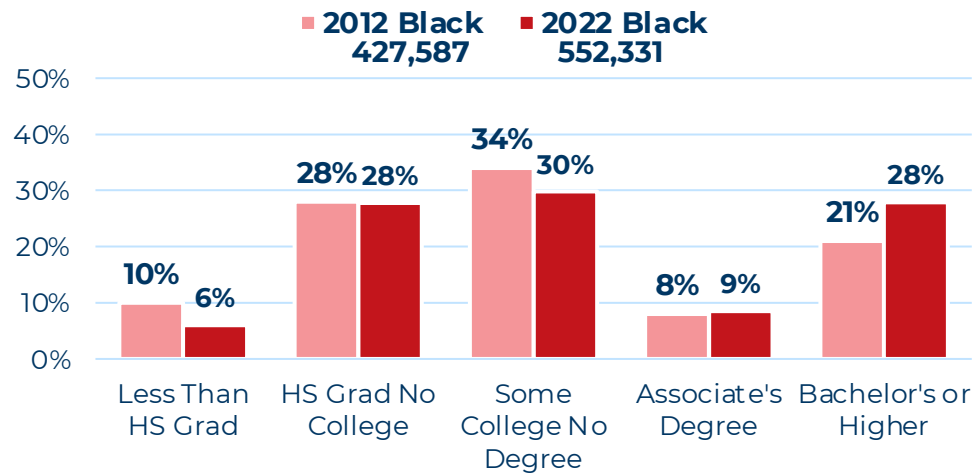
Texas & Dallas County Young Adult (Age 25-34) Count & Educational Attainment, 2012 vs 2022

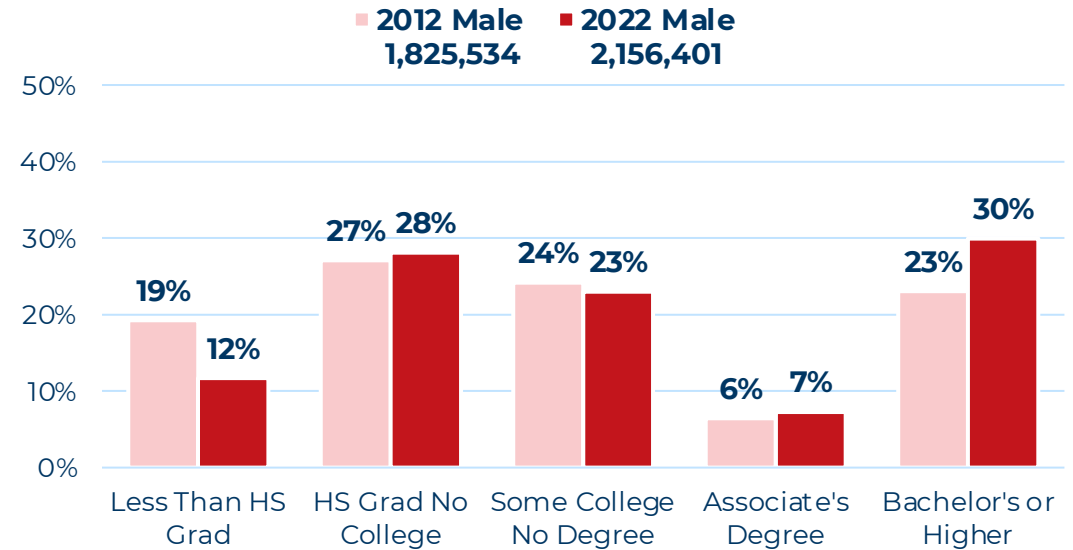
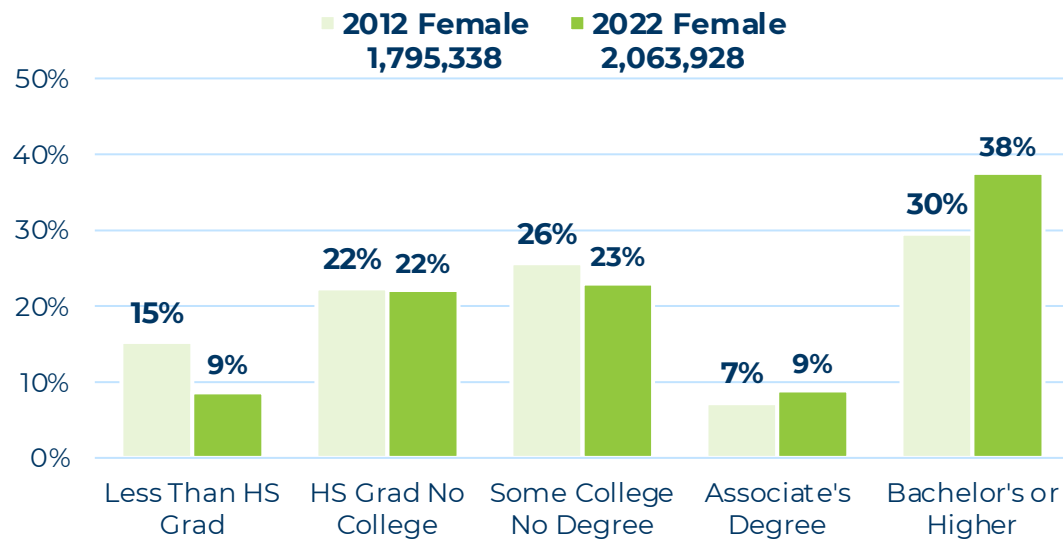
Texas Young Adult (Age 25-34) Count & Educational Attainment by Race, 2012 vs 2022

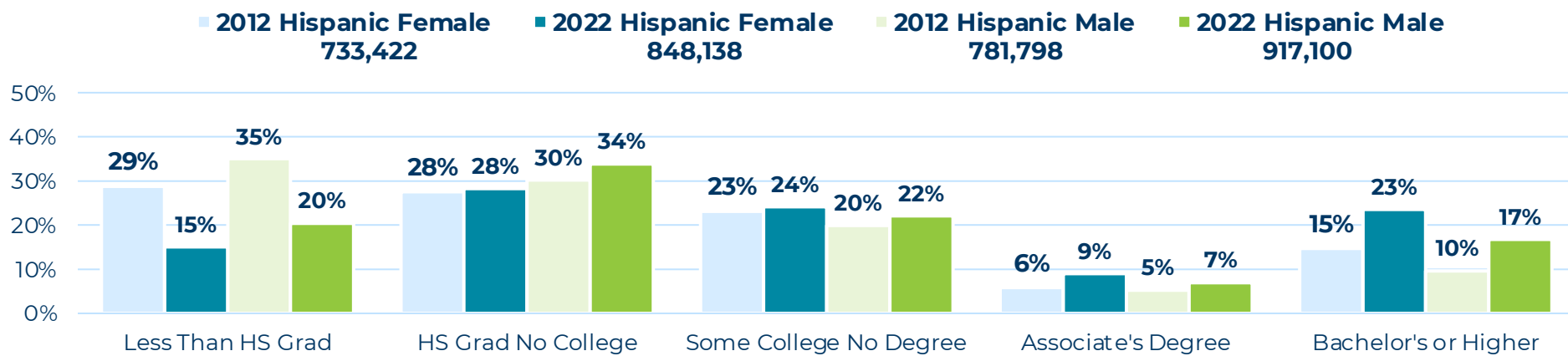
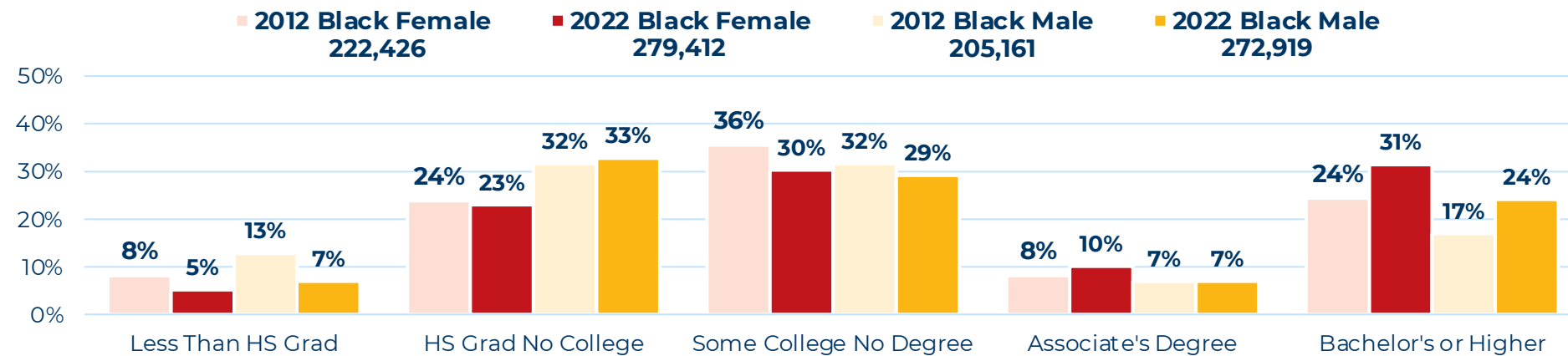
Texas Young Adult (Age 25-34) Count & Educational Attainment by Gender, 2012 vs 2022
